In maths, we've been working on quick recall of number facts. The children have loved taking on daily challenges and trying to beat their previous scores. It's been great fun and brilliant practice!

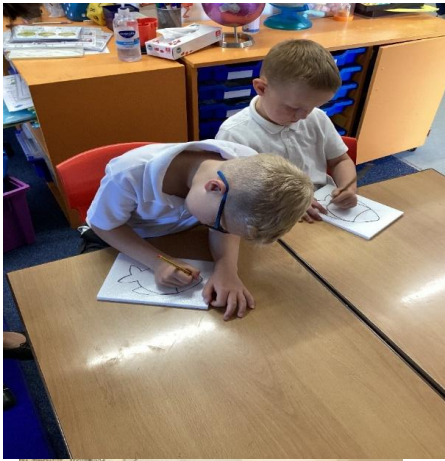
We're also continuing our work on fractions, looking at how to represent them.

We have continued our story of 'my dad's a Birdman' by David Almond. Using our senses, we have been thinking about what the kitchen may look/feel/sound/ taste and smell like as dad creates his wings for the big human flying competition.
