## Class 1

The children are absolute loving Olly the Violinist who is coming every Thursday! They have worked so hard to follow his instructions and are able to use the Violin better than I can! I am so impressed.

Maths we have finished looking at place value up to 20 and are now beginning to recap addition and subtraction within 20!

English the children are coming up with their own versions of the story 'The Papaya that Spoke' (the potato that spoke, the coconut that spoke, the strawberry...)! They are very much enjoying adding their own twists!

## Class 2

We have had some fantastic homework in over the last couple of weeks, from exciting food menus using fair trade items, to fair trade farms made in shoeboxes. We have been learning about how trade has changed throughout time from Tudor and Victorian times to now. Comparing transport and the goods we have traded, the children have even thought about what trade may look like in the future.

In science, we have been exploring bones. We have seen skeletons from humans and animals and thought about how they would help with movement.

We continue our story of the girl who stole an elephant, an exciting adventure about a jewel thief named Chaya.
